SERIES FEATURE | CAYUGA

The fluid shape of the vessels suit their namesake, Cayuga Lake, the longest of New York's Finger Lakes. The lake is about an hour northeast of Corning, New York, where Lino created a limited series of Cayuga vessels. The Cayuga series contrasts with Lino's more spherical vessels in that the Maestro bends the glass into curving contours during the blowing process. Using especially bright and detailed murrini, the Cayuga are a wild combination of color and shape that recall the natural landscape for which the vessels were named. Lino achieves the Cayuga's unique shape by molding the hot glass with cork paddles during the blowing process. By pinching the glass between the two cork paddles, Lino flattens the spherical shape of the vessel, giving each Cayuga its own particular set of contours.
